Periodic Pastoral Ponderings

(From a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear friends in Christ.

"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it; for God has founded it on the seas, and established it on the rivers." Psalm 24:1

Dear partners in witness and service:

We often thank God for all of God's generous gifts to us. Gratitude is a mark of spiritual health. But this talk about "gifts" can create the impression that God has handed ownership over to us. After all, that's how we give gifts to one another.

God does not hand over the ownership of Creation to us. We are not the owners. We are stewards—careful and responsible managers of God's good Creation. In the fine book, Embracing Stewardship, Chick Lane puts it this way:

"With God, there is no transfer of ownership. God is still the owner. Although it may be a bit awkward, we should quit using the 'gift' language in favor of language such as 'trust.' Everything we have is a trust from God, place by God into our care and management."

So we are stewards of God's good creation. We manage what belongs to God. And how we manage what belongs to God is a faith issue. If we are faithful stewards, we will look to God for how we use all of God's possessions that we manage—how we use our time, how we use our talents, and how we use our treasures.

Too often, we connect the word "stewardship" with money—particularly with "paying the bills at church." That is a narrow slot that limits stewardship and chops our faith lives into separate compartments. Every second of our lives belongs to God. Every second of our lives is a trust from God. Every second of our lives is an opportunity to love God and serve our neighbor.

This fall we celebrate God's trust in us under the theme, "Emanuel's Got Talent!" We will hear about how God has entrusted us with more than money. We will be challenged to put our whole selves to work for God's salvation project. You'll hear more about that at worship, in this newsletter, online and through the mail.

You have been entrusted with time, talents and treasure for God's great work of compassion and joy. Together we will pray about how we are called to manage what God has entrusted to us for the good of all.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by President Rosie Spangenberg

Devotions: Connie Solon

Council Agenda:

- Motion by Connie Solon, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the secretary minutes for August 21, 2017. Approved.
- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by Stephen Lewis to approve the Financial Secretary (Consolidated Fund) report. Approved.
- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the Treasurer's Report. Approved.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Elaine Sasso to approve the Capital Fund Report. Approved.
- Motion by Connie Solon, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the Memorial Fund Report. Approved.
- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by Suzanne Winter to approve allowing Pastor Hennigs to take the first five days of December, including Sunday, and the last full week of December (25-31, including Sunday) as vacation. Approved.
- The council received and reviewed the 13 point report from Pastor Hennigs. This included a report from the Pastor regarding the Emanuel Fresh Start Team that met on August 29. There is a potential that Emanuel may receive a new candidate recommended by the Church of Damascus Road. The ELCA Mission Investment Fund has provided feedback on our application for a loan and have asked for additional information about our daycare mission project. The construction committee is waiting for updates on this process. It was also reported that a church member in consultation with council

president received \$300 from the Special Needs Fund. The fund balance is approximately \$1,100. It was reported that home based daycares are dwindling and the need in our area for daycare services has increased. The owner of Midlands has great interest for his employees and it is expected that we may have a waiting list once the daycare facility is open and operating.

- Stephen Lewis gave a report on the Youth and Children's Ministries Committee. There are 11 kids and 7 adults planning to attend the youth gathering in Houston. The Angel Tree Bible Camp was held from July 23-28 and 9 youth plus Pastor Lowell attended. The car wash/coffee hour donation was \$640 less the cost for donuts and coffee and left approximately \$600 to cover the van expenses for the rental van used for the youth mission trip. The final van related expenses were \$559.19. In 2017, fundraisers for the Youth Fund have raised \$3,339.18. The 2017 fundraisers for the 2018 Youth Gathering have raised \$2,405.40.
- Bob Vergamini gave the Property Committee report and reminded us that September 23, 2017 beginning at 8 a.m. is workday at Emanual.
- Suzanne Winter gave the Wider Ministries report. A meeting was held on Sunday, September 17. The Joyful Noise offering for October will be Thanksgiving baskets and for November will be Hope Net. The committee is attempting to compile a list of the last two years recipients of Joyful Noise offerings so they can keep track of what organizations have been invited for Joyful Noise Sundays. A discussion was also held by the committee on how they will solicit names for Thanksgiving baskets for this year. In the past, the names were received from church members who are teachers, but most of those teachers have retired. This year, notice will be in the newsletter and bulletin asking for names of families who might need a basket. Michaela is to take names if she gets phone calls asking about the Thanksgiving baskets. The committee will also contact Kanesville Therapy. They have given names in the past. Names must be submitted on or before November 12, 2017.
- Rosie Spangenberg gave a report for the Worship and Music Committee that met on September 17.
 The Hanging of the Greens will occur on November 29. The Christmas program practice will be

December 6 and December 13 and on December 20 is the Blue Christmas service. Mike Loos is experimenting with different battery operated Holy Spirit candles. The chalice/reserve sign purchases have been ordered. The Fine Arts Festival will take place on October 29 and Boy Scouts will be making pancakes that day. Coffee hour on August 27 raised \$50 for the van fund. Other committees could put this on their wish list and contribute to it. Rosie asks that the ministries at Emanuel provide a description for each committee and she wants this to be a priority for October. It was reported that many people are having difficulty in getting the plastic communion cups out of the communion trays and Marge will research if different sizes/ styles are available. Jonathan Rundman will be

bringing his band for a concert on Saturday, September 22 and Sunday, September 23, 2018. Funds will come from donations. Tickets may be sold for

the concert.

- Pastor Hennigs gave the Evangelism and Visitation Committee report. He reported that mailings are going out and information is being placed on facebook and the church website.
- Connie Solon gave the Mutual Ministries report. This Stewardship Committee met on September 5, 2017 and the theme for this year will be "Emanuel's Got Talent". There will be five temple talks beginning October 22 through November 19. Members will be invited to a dinner on November 12 beginning at 5 p.m. hosted by the youth. There will be an outside speaker named Cindy Johnson. Richard Reed will be making the pledge cards. The Stewardship Committee would like to have all committee budgets by the December council meeting. The Finance Committee wants to review any movement of funds from one category to another before they are made. It is important that donor intent be honored and a policy needs to be adopted to insure that those donor intents are honored.
- Pastor Hennigs gave a report from the Faith Team that went to Denver. He, along with two church members and Pastor Ungs from the Synod office, attended a series of workshops. The role of the Faith Team is to establish core values and a mission statement. Pastor Ungs meets with the Faith Team at

each meeting. There are developing a mission and service for the next generation. It was reported that from 1989 to 2013 church attendance fell from 165 to 70 average weekly attendance. The decline stopped and reversed since 2013 and the average for 2016 was 114.



The consensus is that we prepare to create by gathering information, then we let it ruminate as our conscious brain forgets about it for a while. thoughts, processes, ideas, or other previous creations into a new image, idea, or product. We revise and revise and revise. Final products may again be revised at a later date-after more information gathering, rumination, and illumination takes place. Many of the greatest artists, poets, composers, and novelists have taken a long time to deliver their piece. Holden Evening Prayer by Marty Haugen was a collaborative process. It was sung by the participants at Holden Village and their input was valuable to Marty as he revised, elaborated, cut back, and fine-tuned the piece.

This starting process, this working process, is where we are now in Emanuel. Not only in our fine arts for Reformation Sunday but in the church as a whole. And our ideas, even if they are not fully developed yet, need to be put out there for collaboration to get different perspectives. This is when the egos get left at home- in a jar- with a lid- on the shelf in the basement.

As we prepare our works to be displayed, spoken, and sung on Reformation, we can rest assured that perfection is not the goal. This creative process is starting to unfold here at Emanuel. We will have works in various stages of this process. But the process has begun! The work has begun. And God is leading! Where will this process take us??
