# Periodic Pastoral Ponderings (PPP) (from a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear friends in Christ,

As you will recall from last month's PPP, our Western Iowa Synod Bishop Rodger Prois and our Director for Evangelical Mission, Pastor Jeff Ungs, have invited Emanuel Lutheran Church to enter a process of Congregational Renewal and Redevelopment with me as the pastoral leader at Emanuel Lutheran Church for this process. Pastor Ungs met with our church council in August to further describe this process and to answer questions the church council may have about this process.

The first step in this process is for me to be approved as a Redevelopment Pastor with the ELCA's Division for Evangelical Mission. I will complete an application for approval. Then Pastor Ungs will conduct a preliminary interview. Then I will be interviewed by ELCA churchwide staff for approval. I prayerfully expect that I will be approved for this ministry.

If and when that approval happens (this fall), then the congregation can decide whether to call me as your redevelopment pastor. We have time for that conversation to happen. In the meantime, we can and will move forward with plans and projects that will move us in the redevelopment direction. Those plans and projects really have two emphases. We will focus on spiritual growth in our church family. And we will work to connect to the people around us in the neighborhood and community.

If I am approved as a redevelopment pastor and the congregation votes to accept this invitation, then the congregation would agree to call me for a "term call" of up to five years. Let me review from my last article what that means.

A term call is a call from a congregation for a specified period of time with a specific purpose for that call. The purpose of this term call would be congregational redevelopment and renewal for Emanuel Lutheran Church. Then the congregation would budget some funds (up to \$500) to send me to the ELCA's Mission Redeveloper Training event in Chicago in February of 2016. Then the church council, in consultation with me, would appoint a seven member Renewal Team to oversee this process and report monthly to the church council and quarterly to the congregation on the progress of this process. The Renewal Team would begin its work at the point where the Transition Team has completed its work. If plans for renewal were to involve substantial investments of funds for current staff, for facility renovation, for ministry program materials, or other items related to growing the ministry here, the Renewal Team could develop a plan and submit a funding request to the Division for Evangelical Mission.

A few of you may recall that my contract as interim pastor here comes to an end on October 31, 2015. That contract can be extended on a month to month basis by mutual agreement between the church council and me. So we will continue with that arrangement until other decisions have been made.

You may also know by now that our Parish Assistant (and my spouse), Brenda, has accepted a position with UPS in Omaha as a human resources specialist. We will all miss having her skills and talents applied to our ministry here. I love working side by side with her and have enjoyed every minute of that work. But I know that the Holy Spirit is already raising up the next person for that ministry at Emanuel. We will let you know as soon as we have hired a new person for that role. Thank you for all your prayerful support!

## Emanuel Welcomes Our First Returning Citizen

By now you have probably met Monte Manser, our new friend in Christ. Monte has come to us from the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility, where he was an active participant in the Church of the Damascus Road. Monte is sponsored by the Emanuel Fresh Start Team (EFST). EFST is a group of Emanuel folks who have made a commitment to assist Monte as he re-enters the community and is re-integrated into responsible and law-abiding society.

EFST works with the Reentry/Reintegration ministry of the Church of the Damascus Road. This ministry connects local teams to ex-offenders who are seeking to live in a different way. This ministry is very much like refugee resettlement. EFST is assisting Monte to secure housing, employment, furnishings, clothing and other necessary items for living. The goal is to help Monte achieve full independence and self-sufficiency over the course of the next year. We know that ex-offenders with no support tend to re-offend at a rate of about sixty percent. We know that ex-offenders with this kind of support re-offend at a rate of less than five percent.

You will have many opportunities to get acquainted with Monte, to hear his story, and to encourage him in his journey. Please keep Monte, EFST, and the Church of the Damascus Road in your prayers in the coming weeks and months. Thank you for all you have already done to support this mission project!

# Anniversary Team Sponsors "An Evening to Remember" on September 20<sup>th</sup>

The next event in our 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration is called "An Evening to Remember." That event will be held on September 20<sup>th</sup> from 5 to 7 p.m. All current and former members and friends of Emanuel Lutheran Church are invited to participate.



The evening will begin with prayer and a potluck meal at 5 p.m. We will dismiss for the meal by tables to have an orderly meal service. People will be invited to share their favorite Emanuel stories, first at the tables and then with the large group as time permits. It is helpful if a few notes from the stories are put on sticky notes along with approximate dates and people involved. The more stories the better. We will go from table to table, one story at a time. At the end of the evening, people will be invited to put their sticky notes on the appropriate part of the timeline on the wall.

In the last 30 to 45 minutes, Pastor Lowell will facilitate the development of "meaning statements"—patterns that arise out of the stories shared. These statements are valuable to understand ourselves currently and to think about future ministry and mission here at Emanuel. The event will close with prayer and community cleanup.

  - Emanuel's group saved from their daily meal allowance and were able to give \$378 in the Gathering's last day (Sunday) Worship service (They tithed !!!)

"On days when I'm not here, I'm always thinking about what Jamalia and her roommate are doing," said Haley, an LSI staff who has known Jamalia for a long time. "I enjoy being here. It's rewarding to see someone grow and learn and succeed."

Jamalia speaks with few words, and those who know her well say she uses something else instead to express herself: her wonderful smile.

## Emanuel women HAVE Fair Trade coffee for sale in the Fellowship Hall!

Thanks for your awesome support of this new ministry! We have had several requests for different flavors and types of coffee so check the coffee corner weekly for new items!

A bit of information on LWR Coffee Project!



Started in 1996, the LWR Coffee Project is collaboration between Equal Exchange and Lutheran World Relief to involve Lutheran communities and individuals in

supporting small farmers around the world.

For each pound of fairly traded coffee, tea, and foods Lutherans purchase through the LWR Coffee Project, 20 cents per pound goes to LWR's Small Farmer Fund. That Fund amounted to \$34,435.48 in 2014 alone!

The Small Farmers Fund has supported a number of LWR projects across multiple regions. Below, are a few projects that the SFF supported in recent years:

- "Strengthening Small Coffee Farmers in Flores through Capacity Building;" Program Dates 10/14– 9/15; This project aims to improve the livelihood and strengthen the ability of 100 small-scale farmers in Flores, Indonesia through teaching sustainable agriculture efforts.
- APOKO: Coffee producers working together in Rachuonyo South to sustain their livelihoods; LWR worked to improve the livelihood of more than 5,500 coffee producers in the Rachounyao South district in Kenya by significantly increasing both coffee production and farmers' income.

A Note about Equal Exchange: Equal Exchange is a Fair Trade organization that buys directly from small-scale farmer cooperatives, owned and run by the farmers themselves. Because our farmer partners are paid above market prices for their crops, they are able to make investments in community projects, educational programs, and technical trainings. These cooperative organizations also help keep rural communities healthy and strong, and keep local cultures vibrant. Equal Exchange is also committed to supporting sustainable farming methods that help green the earth through reforestation, natural resource conservation and organic practices.

#### 125<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY COMMITTEE NEWS

#### Remember when . . .

"Beginning Our Second Century of Service"

1990 was an exciting year at Emanuel, not only were we celebrating our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, we were in the midst of a major building project. In 1989 a number of churches were visited for ideas, Oliver Over presented a proposed building plan and an architect was chosen. Dick Rogers Construction Co. was hired to build the new addition.

\$350,000 was borrowed for the purpose of building a new sanctuary, fellowship hall and parking lot. In May the concrete floors were poured, metal studs with drywall erected, brick facing begun and the beginning of the heating & cooling system installed. By July the roof was being finished, light fixtures & furnaces installed and sidewalk poured.

#### Statistics:

- 1000 yds. of carpet @\$ 2.15 per yd.
- 100 gallons of paint @ \$1150
- \$5900 for kitchen cabinets & installation
- \$1541.45 for counter tops
- \$475 for kitchen serving window
- \$1197 for quarry tile
- 25 tables @ \$75 each
- 20 dozen stacking chairs @ \$10 each
- 200 Hymnals
- 11 stained glass windows in sanctuary
- 3 stained glass windows in narthex
- 33 new pews were built and installed at a cost of \$13,805.

Volunteer "Christ Carpenters", members of Emanuel, were doing much of the interior work such as painting, staining & varnish; they also moved the existing kitchen cabinets and installed them in the new workroom.

August was spent completing projects from the ceiling to the floor tiles and everything in between.

September 9, 1990 was Dedication Sunday with 305 in attendance, Pastor Alvin Jenkins lead the parade from the upper sanctuary through the lower parking lot and into the new sanctuary as we sang our anniversary song "Borning Cry". It was a sight to behold.

In his message to the congregation Pastor Jenkins said this, "We are new pioneers for the beginning of the second century. Though we do not have to leave comfortable homes and travel thousands of miles to have our visions and dreams come true. we must make a leap of faith in order to fulfill the commitment that each generation makes to Christ through personal sacrifice and dedicated hard work. With God's spirit hovering over this congregation for one hundred years, He has given us much for which to be thankful. I hope that future generations will look back at us and be grateful for the contributions that we have made, as we are grateful for those of our forefathers, and that they can say that indeed we had our visions and our dreams come true."

On November 11, 1990 a Promissory Note and Mortgage was signed in the amount of \$314,000 with monthly payments of \$3423 to the Aid Association for Lutherans @ 10 1/4%.

#### Council Minutes for 8/11/2015

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. by President Kevin Epperson.

#### Council Agenda:

- The meeting began with a presentation by Reverend Jeff Ungs who is the director of the Evangelical Mission and Pastor for the Transformational Ministry. He told the council that renewal congregations are in decline. ELCA Funding is available on a three year process beginning in February. He indicated that Lowell Hennigs is a renewal pastor with a term limit. He explained that Emanuel must file an application and that we need a renewal name. The process will begin in February of 2017 and last for three years. We must send two lay people and the pastor to an Outreach Program and the cost to Emanuel would be the cost of sending those people to the program. There is up to \$50,000 available for the Outreach over the three years, but Emanuel must account for the use of these funds and it depends upon our need and our plan for use of these funds. Pastor Hennigs' contract expires in October of 2015. Our next step is to call a pastor who then must go through a pre-interview with Reverend Ungs. Reverend Ungs made it clear that Reverend Hennigs would certainly pass the pre-interview.
- Oscar Over moved and Matt Solon seconded approval of the secretary minutes without amendments. Approved.
- Motion by Oscar Over, seconded by Carrie Hansen to approve the financial secretary report. Approved.
- Motion by Oscar Over, seconded by Ruth Sullivan to approve the Treasurer's Report. Approved.
- Motion by Matt Solon, seconded by Penny Dahlke to approve the Capital Fund Report. Approved.
- Motion by Oscar Over, seconded by Matt Solon, to approve the Memorial Fund report. Approved
- Pastor's written report was submitted and he called attention to the following items:
  - 1. Adult Study on Thursday mornings.
  - 2. Communion service fourth Monday of each month at Midlands Living Center.
  - 3. The Anniversary Team met on July 13.
  - 4. A joint Habitat for Humanity project is being discussed for September.
  - 5. The Emanuel Fresh Start Team met in June and July and prepared to receive the application from Monte Manser for a Fresh Start project.
  - 5. The pastor is involved in the planning of "Confest", the regional confirmation gathering sponsored by Western Iowa Synod, in the fall and spring. Emanuel will host a gathering on October 14.
    - 6. Emanuel sponsored a Lutheran Lakeside Day Camp from July 27 to July 31.
  - 7. The pastor is preparing new Bible classes for young people, confirmation preparation and beginning of confirmation classes on September 20.
    - 8. The pastor will be on vacation from August 24 through August 30.
- The Youth and Children's Ministry Report was received.
- There was no report for Fellowship and Support.

- The Property Committee reported that the office door had been repaired and that there will be a work day for painting on August 29. Rick Stone will make calls. The garage sale brought in over \$1,500. Christmas ornaments are for sale for \$10. Contact Chris Reed. There will be a fire pit event in October.
- Wider Ministries reported that there will be Joyful Noise for Habitat, but that we have received no feedback from Habitat concerning a future project. We should start to consider a Plan B.
- No report was provided by the Worship and Music, Evangelism and Visitation and Mutual Ministries Committees.

#### New Business:

- Suzanne Winter reported that Vicki McClelland would repair the stained glass window from the old church for \$600. Building and installation would be extra. We want it completed by November 15. Suzanne Winter moved and Chris Reed seconded approval for frame, electrical and installation in Fellowship Hall. Approved.
- Connie Solon reported that Cindy Richards requested monies from the Music Fund that has a balance of \$353 and the Strings and Things Fund to pay one-half of the music that Brett Epperson is composing for the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. No action was taken.
- Motion was made by Oscar Over and seconded by Chris Reed to transfer \$1,173.67 from the garage sale fund to the Worship and Music Fund. This is money from the 2014 garage sale fund. Approved.
